On October 18, 1976, the Washington State Licensed Commercial Fishermen moved for a declaratory ruling on the issue of the authority of the Washington State Energy Facility Site Evaluation Council to award compensation to the Washington State Licensed Commercial Fishermen for their economic losses, if any, as a result of the alleged fish kill.

Subsequently, on December 2, 1976, Examiner Robert A. Felthous issued an examiner's order which stated that the Washington State Energy Facility Site Evaluation Council has no authority in this proceeding to award compensation to the Washington State Licensed Commercial Fishermen.

The Washington State Licensed Commercial Fishermen have, subsequently, filed exceptions to the examiner's order.

The Energy Facility Site Evaluation Council at its meeting on January 10, 1977, and as confirmed by telephone and in writing to parties on January 11, 1977, requested that all parties serve upon the Council members those documents that may have relevance to this matter,


ORDER

WHEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, that Examiner Felthous' examiner's order dated December 2, 1976 stating that the Washington State Energy Facility Site Evaluation Council has no authority in this proceeding to award compensation to the Washington State

Licensed Commercial Fishermen shall be, and the same is hereby, affirmed and adopted as the order of the Council.




