

Resolution No. 119

WHEREAS by letter of April 19, 1977 the Washington Public Power Supply System (WPPSS) did request in accordance with Section III.I of the Site Certification Agreement for WPPSS Nuclear Projects Nos. 3 & 5 that the Council agree on the method of disposal for stumps and slash; and

WHEREAS the Council recognizes that open burning is the most cost effective alternative for the disposal of stumps and slash and that environmental impacts caused through gas and particulate emissions and deposition of ash can be effectively managed by imposing conditions on open burning;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Energy Facility Site Evaluation Council that it agrees to disposal of slash and stumps from land clearing by controlled open burning subject to the following conditions:

1. High stack burning, height no less than diameter;
2. Clean piles, free of dirt;
3. No more than six fires at any one time;
4. No new fire ignited until previous fire is totally extinguished;
5. No new fire ignited during an air pollution episode and existing fires shall be extinguished in a reasonable manner;
6. No burning of prohibited materials;
7. There shall be no burning when winds are in the direction of populated areas;
8. Necessary personnel and equipment shall be available to prevent any spread of the fires;
9. WPPSS shall comply with the conditions of draft burning permits for construction clearing (Attachment A) and Right of Way debris piles (Attachment B), as prepared by the Department of Natural Resources; and

10. Monitoring of the implementation of this resolution by the Department of Natural Resources is authorized by the Council.

CHECK WITH THE LOCAL DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES OFFICER FOR RULES ALLOWING BURNING SMALL FIRES UNDER CERTAIN CONDITIONS WITHOUT A WRITTEN BURNING PERMIT.

SUBJECT TO CANCELLATION

If fire escapes, regardless of cause, the permittee hereby voluntarily agrees to hire men and equipment at his own expense to fight and suppress the same and to pay to the State Department of Natural Resources or any other approved fire fighting agency for any and all reasonable expenses incurred by it or them in fighting and suppressing the same, unless such expenses are payable pursuant to RCW 76.04.515. Provided that if the fire escapes due to the negligence of permittee, permittee must reimburse the Landowner Contingency Fund for expenses paid from it.

Permittee is responsible for any claims arising out of the activities performed under this permit, including claims resulting from fire, smoke or water.

The fire must not include rubber products, plastics, asphalt, garbage, dead animals, or any similar materials that emit dense smoke or create offensive odors when burned, unless written permission has been obtained from the local air pollution authority or the Department of Ecology.

THIS PERMIT SUBJECT TO THE SMOKE MANAGEMENT PLAN IN EFFECT AT THE TIME OF BURNING. SUCH PLAN IS AVAILABLE FOR INSPECTION AT DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES FIELD OFFICES.

CHECK WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES FOR THE FIRE WEATHER AND SMOKE MANAGEMENT FORECAST BEFORE LIGHTING ANY FIRE.

IF THE FIRE CREATES A NUISANCE FROM SMOKE OR FLY ASH, IT MUST BE EXTINGUISHED.

THIS PERMIT IS SUSPENDED DURING ANY STAGE OF AN AIR POLLUTION EPISODE, AS DEFINED IN RCW 70.94.710-730, WHEN DECLARED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF ECOLOGY.

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
