Purpose of the proposal and its anticipated effects, including any changes in existing rules: The proposed changes are to bring out-of-date items in 24 of the 26 chapters in Title 463 WAC into alignment with current statutes, rules, and EFSEC's internal operations, including updates to EFSEC's address, corrections to statutory and regulatory references due to changes (e.g., E2SHB 1812 that created EFSEC as independent agency), and style changes per the Code Reviser's Office style guide. None of the changes are substantive.  Reasons supporting proposal: In many cases, the rules have not changed since inception in the 1970s or even since 2004. In that time, EFSEC has moved, and the use of email and websites have come into modern use. Additionally, EFSEC's own statute has changed significantly in some parts, the Public Records Act was recodified, and other statutes, such as the Environmental Health Law Reorganization Act-SHB2246, were adopted. The rules correct information and references in order to make them simpler for users to navigate.  Statutory authority for adoption: RCW 80.50.040(1)
