The former governor of our state, Jay Ensley, without ballot measure, has forced upon us these lithium battery storage systems in Skagit County.

When these storage systems catch fire, they destroy the land, air and water quality. We have watched the Moss Landing battery storage fires in California still burning for months while putting dangerous chemicals into the air, water and soil. One fire here would displace thousands of families plus destroy the many organic farms, fish and wildlife habitats, and the livelihoods of those who depend on the many industries in our area.

Skagit citizens do not want these battery storage systems. In fact, most Skagit residents don't even know these battery storage systems are going to be placed near their homes, farms, and wildlife preservation areas, like the Bayview Estuary.
