The buffer zone for the ferruginous hawk should remain the same or have an even longer distance from any nest. Furthermore, I'm concerned for the entire bird population! What about the eagles that will be maimed or killed as well? If one of us homeowners killed an eagle, we would get a stiff fine and maybe even jailed but these wind developers get a pass for a certain number of eagle kills! How can that even be allowed?? What about the sandhill cranes and geese, etc. that fly south every fall? The autumn bird migration is in full swing and they primarily fly at night heading straight into turbine blades that they can't see. We hear and see hundreds of them in the sky during the day too; when those blades are rotating, there will be a graveyard full of dead birds. One of my neighbors recently had a ferruginous hawk perch on their deck railing and have seen it or its mate more than once. They also took a video of the sandhill cranes flyover. (I've included both the photo and the video.) Who is going to keep track of how many birds die before the scavengers and predators take them?? Who will be posted at the base of each turbine to count the bird and bat kills?? Let's prioritize bird-safe methods and technology to protect them and our environment. The unintended consequences of disrupting our natural ecosystems highlights the importance of understanding the need for informed, sustainable approaches when siting turbines or better yet, don't site them at all on the HHH location right in the direct path of the bird migration.
