Having reviewed Resolution 357 during the current public comment period, I am submitting my request that EFSEC Council postpone approval of it. Concern: While the EFSEC staff provided a more generous public comment period than the previous two periods, they did not allow themselves adequate time to seriously consider the public comments before the Council meets on Wednesday. Concern: The resolution contains no specific information about what will be left after the turbines located within the 2-mile buffer of the four nests discussed, making it impossible for anyone to comment intelligently on the impact to the remaining project. Concern: The resolution includes a statement recommending that the Council decline to make a decision on one nest because the SCA did not authorize placement of any primary components within the area. There is nothing to prevent the Certificate Holder from amending the SCA to change that. Declining to decide leaves the door wide open. Concern: The resolution feels like approval to allow the Certificate Holder to proceed with project layout and design without considering the other 16 requirements listed in the PTAG Rules of Procedure, at least 2 of which are intended to inform the layout and design. Solution: I respectfully request that EFSEC postpone consideration of Resolution No. 357 until staff has had sufficient time to digest the public comments and revise the resolution accordingly. That should be followed by a second comment period with ample time for the public to comment and EFSEC staff time to seriously consider the comments. The revised resolution should contain a map showing the specific locations of the remaining turbines, solar and other project components once the .6- and 2-mile nest buffers are implemented. This will negate the need to publish confidential information while giving the public factual information on which to intelligently comment. Respectfully submitted, Tom Brun Benton County Resident
