Thank you for reaching out and expressing your concerns. You are correct, there are two Battery Energy Storage Systems (BESS) proposed in Skagit County, one proposed near the airport in an area zoned heavy industrial and the other is proposed east of Sedro-Woolley in the Agricultural-NRL zone.

The BESS system proposed near the airport was reviewed by Skagit County Planning and Development Services and was recently approved by the Skagit County Hearing Examiner. The project has been appealed by a citizen group to the Skagit County Board of County Commissioners. The BESS system proposed east of Sedro-Wolley is currently being reviewed by the Washington State Energy Facility Siting Evaluation Council (EFSEC). I was nominated by
